Research Methodology

SURVEY METHODOLOGY

The Akron Decides Survey was conducted with 510 residents of Akron, Ohio, yielding a 4.3% margin of error at a 95% confidence level. Data Collection began on January 17 and ended on February 4, 2023. Surveys were conducted online and over the phone including both landline and cell phones. Small weights were applied to the final data to ensure the final sample is representative of the adult population of the city of Akron.



Overall, would you say that the City of Akron is on the right track or the wrong track?








Feeling Safe in Neighborhood

How safe do you feel in your neighborhood?




Change in Sense of Safety

Overall, how would you rate the job that the Akron police department does in keeping Akron safe?




Personal Future Financial Situation in Akron

Overall, how would you rate your personal, future financial situation in the city of Akron?




Rating of Akron's Efforts to Improve Local Economy




Rating of Affordability of Housing Market in Akron

How would you rate how affordable the real estate market is in Akron for you?








Living Situation






Overall, how would you rate efforts by the city of Akron in each of the following areas?






Plan to Vote in Primary


Likelihood of Voting




Importance of Traits in Next Mayor

Thinking about the next mayor of Akron, how important are the following traits to you?




Usefulness of a Debate among Candidates

How useful would a debate among the Akron mayoral candidates be to you in deciding which candidate to vote for?




Importance in a Debate

In a debate, how important are the following things to you in judging the candidates?




Main Source of Local News

Among the announced candidates for mayor of Akron, which candidate would you vote for if the election were held today? (before & up to filing deadline)







Respondent Gender






Sexual Orientation
















Own or Rent










